8. Take a look at 4:35,39. What do these verses make very clear? Remember these verses when you talk with people who believe in multiple gods.
9. According to 4:29-30, how does one find the Lord?
10. Review the commandments and their meaning (chapter 5).
11. Try to memorize Deuteronomy 6:4.
12. Why were the Israelites to leave no survivors when they conquered another nation?
13. What does 8:19-20 say the punishment for worshipping false gods is?
14. Read 11:18-21. What does this tell us about God's Word and what we should do about it?
15. What kinds of animals were the people not allowed to eat?
16. What is the tithe? What was the tithe used for (14:28-29)?
17. How was debt service handled in chapter 15? Why was it handled this way?

5. In the parable of the tenants, who is the owner of the vineyard, the servants, and the son symbols of?
6. In 12:26-27, how does the verse indicate there is life after death and why would Jesus share this with the Sadducees?
7. What law does Jesus use to summarize all the Old Testament laws?
8. Why was Jesus so impressed with the widows offering? What is more important to Jesus, the heart of the amount? What does this say to us?
9. When do you think Christ will come again? Are you afraid of this event? How can we be ready? Who alone knows when the end of the earth will come?
