1. Read 33:7. How do you think this verse can apply to Jesus Christ?
2. Who did Moses die and where?
3. Who takes over the leadership and what instructions does God give this person?
4. Who is Rahab and what does she do?
5. How did the people cross the Jordan River?
6. How was the city of Jericho taken?
7. Read 6:20. When the city of Jericho was found by archaeologists, they found that the walls had fallen outward rather than inward. What do you think would be unusual about the walls falling outward? Where did Rahab live? They found a section of the wall that did not fall at all. Who do you think might have lived there and what may have happened?
8. Who was Achan and what was his sin? How was the whole nation affected by the sin of this one man? What does this tell us about sin?
9. Who was the city of Ai taken? What type of military leader is Joshua?
10. What covenant was reviewed at Mt. Ebal and Mt. Gerizim?
11. How did the Gibeonites trick the Israelites?
12. Has every day been 24 hours (chapter 10)?
13. Did any other king besides the King of Gibeon try to make a treaty of peace with Israel?
14. How did the military campaign of the Israelites go in the early stages?
15. What lands or nations were not conquered?
16. In Joshua 14:6-15, how old was Caleb? What kind of person was he? What was he still involved in? What lesson do we learn from Caleb about life after 65?

2. Why did Joseph have to take Mary to Bethlehem? Read Micah 5:2. Why was it necessary for Mary to give birth to Jesus in Bethlehem?
3. After the shepherds visited the baby Jesus, what did they go on to do? What lesson do we learn from these shepherds?
4. Who is Simeon and what do the words of his prophecy mean?
5. Who is Anna and what do we learn about good habits from her?
6. What do we learn about the early life of Jesus?
7. Luke 3 gives a more detailed account of John the Baptist. What are the major themes in his message?
8. How do we see God in His fullness in 3:21-22?
9. How old was Jesus when he began his ministry? Why did he wait so long?
10. Is the genealogy of Luke 3 different from the one in Matthew 1? Why do you think that is the case?
11. Take a look at 4:13. What does this tell us of the devil's battle plans?
12. Why was Jesus kicked out of his home town?
13. Where did Jesus usually preach in Judea? Why?
