12. In 12:28, what deeper meaning do you get from this?
13. What does 15:1-4 tell us about the tongue?
14. What is your favorite verse in chapter 16?

1. Read carefully the definition of love (agape) in 13:4-8. How can this love be made a greater part of our lives? How would you interpret 13:9-12?
2. What does chapter 14 have to say about speaking in tongues?
3. Notice in particular what Paul is saying in 14:19. Why do you think he is stressing that?
4. What is made clear about how God wants worship to be carried out in 14:33 and 14:40?
5. How can 14:34-35 be interpreted in relation to 11:5 (note: the word for break in 14:34 is generally to be interpreted “preach”).)?
6. What do you think the word “prophecy” means?
7. How does Paul start his discourse on the resurrection in 15:3-6?
8. Read 15:14-19. What would be the case if Christ had not risen from the dead?
9. Look carefully at the context of 15:24-29. Also understand that the Greek word for the word “for” also can mean “over”. Does this shed any additional light on how this section could be interpreted differently?
10. The Greeks often followed an Epicurean philosophy which believed “let us eat, drink and be merry for tomorrow we die”. How does Paul address this belief in chapter 15?
11. What does 15:42-44 say about bodily resurrection?
12. What does 16:2 say about Christians giving?
13. Memorize 16:14. How can we apply this to our lives in stronger ways?
14. How was Paul’s ministry in Asia being received according to chapter 1 of II Corinthians?
15. What deposit has God put in our hearts guaranteeing our salvation?
