5. What is to be the fate of Moab? Ammon? Edom?
6. What is to happen to Babylon (chapter 50)? What is interesting about this prophecy? Who ultimately overpowers the Babylonians? Do Jeremiah's predictions come true?
7. What happens to the temple and the things contained in it after the final siege of the Babylonians?
8. According to prophecy in Jeremiah, was Babylon going to rebound after its defeat to the Persians? What would happen to the Jews according to Jeremiah's prophecy?
9. How does the book of Jeremiah end?
10. How do you think Lamentations got its name?
11. What terrible things happened within the city walls of Jerusalem while they were under siege by the Babylonians?
12. What is the theme of Lamentations?
13. What plea is made in 5:21-22?
