1. In the census in Numbers, who were counted (1:18) and how was the census carried out? How many were there? Which tribe was not included?
2. How would each Israelite know where to set up camp (2:2)?
3. Before the Levites were assigned to assist Aaron in the office of priest, what group of people were designated for religious duty?
4. What was the job of the Kohathite branch of the Levites (4:15)? The Gershonite clan (4:25)? The Mararite clan (4:31-32)? Notice the age specifications?
5. What is the law of jealousy in chapter 5?
6. What is a Nazarite? How is the Nazarite vow removed from an individual (6:18)?
7. Look at 6:22-26. What do we learn from this section?
8. What was the age when someone could become a priest and when did they retire (8:24-25)?
9. How did this huge community know when it was time to gather together of to move on (10:1-8)?
10. How does Moses get relief in 11:16-17? What happened when the Spirit rested on these men in 11:25? What is unique about the work of the Holy Spirit as we have seen so far in the Old Testament in comparison to the work of the Holy Spirit in the New Testament?
11. Who also turned against Moses in 12:1? Have you ever been in a position when you felt the world was against you?
12. Read 12:6-8. How did God reveal Himself to Moses? How did God reveal Himself to others at that time?
13. How many men went to explore the promised land? How were they chosen? What did they find out? What reports did they bring back? What was different about the report of Joshua and Caleb?
14. Because of the lack of faith of the Israelites, who could not enter the promised land?
