
God's Christmas Gift to You: A Reflection on Grace Through the Love of Jesus

Christmas is a time when we exchange gifts as a token of love and gratitude. But the greatest gift ever given wasn't wrapped in glittering paper or placed under a tree—it was wrapped in swaddling clothes and laid in a manger. Closing Reflection: Christmas is not just a season of giving; it is the ultimate reminder of what has been given to us—God's grace through the love of Jesus. This grace fills us with joy, renews our hope, and calls us to live in peace. Let this Christmas be a time to unwrap the fullness of God's love and let it transform your heart, your relationships, and your future. God's gift is yours to receive—joyful, hopeful, and eternal.

7-Day Christmas Devotion: God's Gift of Hope, Harmony, and Happiness

Theme: *Because Everyone Matters to God*

Each day centers on a gift God gives us through Jesus, focusing on hope, harmony, and happiness. Biblical references, stories, and spiritual quotes are woven in to reflect the beauty of God's grace for all people.

Day 1: The Gift of Hope – God's Promise Fulfilled
